What:

CITYarts continues to restore its 400 ft. long Mosaic Rolling Bench at General Grant National Memorial in New York City. The Bench adds a whimsical and uplifting space to an otherwise somber environment. This project has engaged thousands of community volunteers since its creation. We will continue this community involvement with a new generation of community families, schools, and volunteers, laying the groundwork for generations to come. This restoration will continue the cleanup that was completed in Summer 2023 and will be led by a professional mosaic artist. This project is being done in collaboration with the National Park Service.
